A Little DIY guide to carving wooden mushrooms by Richard Irvine

These instructions assume that you are already comfortable using sharp hand—tools and that you have asked an adult to help if that's what you need to do.

You will need:


A **SHARP** knife

A saw



A knot free length of wood (willow or another soft hardwood) at least 40cm long and 4 - 5 cm diameter

- 1. Find a place to saw where the wood won't move around. e.g. a sawhorse, workmate, picnic table.
- 3. Measure how long you want the mushroom stem to be and saw the whole thing off the branch.



2. About 6 - 7 cm from one end. saw a groove about 1cm deep all the way round the branch.
